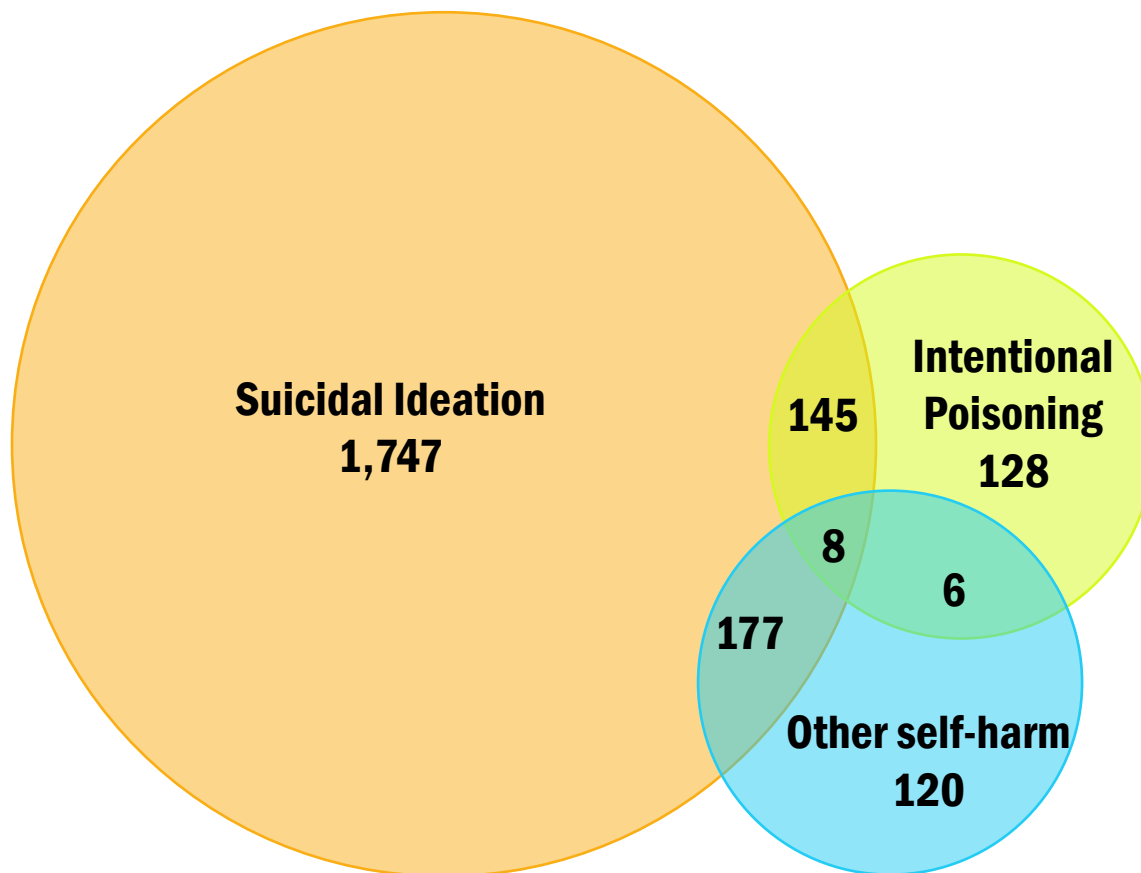


Suicide-Related Emergency Department Visits

Most Suicide-Related Emergency Department Visits are for Suicidal Ideation.

Between January 1 – June 30, 2021 Vermont Emergency Departments (EDs) saw 2,376 suicide-related ED visits.* Of these visits, 1,747 mentioned suicidal ideation (SI); 177 self-harm with SI; 145 intentional poisoning and SI; 128 intentional poisonings; 120 other self-harm; 8 SI, intentional poisoning, and self-harm; and 6 self-harm and intentional poisonings.



A suicide-related ED visit has a chief complaint, admission reason, or discharge diagnosis for suicidal ideation or a form of self-harm.
